It's what you see technicians handling daily in ODFs and racks. Use cases: Device-to-ODF, ODF-to-ODF, cross-connections, quick swaps. It ensures a secure connection by combining wires with a wire connector, like a twist-on connector or a wire nut, and then linking them to the intended terminal or fixture. Similar to coaxial cable, but there is no mesh shielding layer, which is used as a patch cord from the equipment to the fiber.
